I thought Ami Simms was wonderful and insightful. My mother had Alzheimer's for 10 years, lived with me for 5. I loved the way Ami did not take herself and her quilting too seriously. Maybe we all need to let our inner doubts go and just create. If you were to take a piece a fabric and place it somewhere on the vertical part of your body, where would you place it? It doesn't matter where, but it does matter that you recognize and own it.

I hope many of you go to the Comfort Quilts workshops or make them at home to donate. I hope many, more than the 72 quilts we had last year, make the "Green" Challenge Quilts to benefit NEQM, ACA and QC. This is an easy way to "pay it forward". I hope more of you come on the Get-away and have a great time and meet new friends and I hope you make and submit quilts to our annual Quilt Show. I hope all of you sell or buy your raffle tickets, this is another easy way to help your guild and hope all of you feel inspired, as I do, every month by the speakers and workshops.

Everyday is an opportunity to create, to change, to research, to discover, to add a new quest to your quilting addiction. Yes, it is because I need to sew and I think you do too.

New England Quilt Museum News

The next exhibit at the NEQM is called: Kinder Komforts: Amish Crib quilts

March 4 - May 9, 2010

An exhibition of Amish quilting unlike any other, curated by Bettina Havig, *Kinder Komforts* shows a new facet of the tradition to explore. Made for hard wear, these antique quilts, though crafted with exquisite workmanship and traditional Amish color palettes, are much more free in their style and composition than full-scale works from Mennonite communities, since they were not intended to be heirlooms. Indeed, part of the significance of the exhibition is the rarity of these quilts, most of which were demolished with use.

During the *Kinder Komforts* exhibition, the museum will also feature the work of Dorothy Bosselman. The late artist set out to recreate 60 historic Amish quilts, most of which were originally made in the early 20th century, in miniature. Her replica quilts, some no larger than 6" square, were originally created for the exhibit *Beacons from a Darkened World, Amish Life-Amish Quilts* at the New England Quilt Museum in the spring of 1990, of which she was guest curator. They were hand-quilted by her friends and by NEQM volunteers, in precise, traditional designs. The Bosselman quilts were recently acquired by the museum and will be exhibited for the first time in many years.

Gerald Roy will give a talk on the Amish use of color in conjunction with the exhibition on Saturday, April 17, 2010 at 1pm.

NEQM Member Guild Challenge

"From Lobstah to Green Monstah: What's Best About New England"

Images 2010, the Lowell Quilt Festival, and the New England Quilt Museum have issued a First Annual Challenge to member guilds. Challenge entries will be featured in a Special Exhibit at the Images Quilt Show, August 12-14, 2010. Entries will then be donated to the New England Quilt Museum for a fund-raiser event to take place at a later date.

Challenge Rules: One (1) quilt from each NEQM Member Guild. The guild's entry may be made by multiple guild members or by one person representing the entire guild. The quilt's perimeter must measure no more than 144 inches and no less than 96 inches. The quilt must include one or more "Mariner Compass" and/or "Delectable Mountains" blocks. Your quilt may be original or traditional in design, pieced or appliquéd, and embellished in any way you choose. Due Date: June 30, 2010.
