Quilt Show Display Guidelines

All entries must have a permanent label sewn to the back of the quilt or inside the garment. Include your name, town and date at a minimum. The guild cannot be responsible for items that are not properly labeled. The members working check-in will not be allowed to accept quilts or garments without identifying labels. At check in, our workers will be attaching an ID number to the lower right back corner of your quilt. If you want to protect this area of your quilt from our pins, please place your label in that area or sew a piece of muslin to that corner to accept our pin.

All quilts must have at least a 4" wide sleeve sewn across the top of the quilt back. Quilts over 50" wide should have a split sleeve to allow for an extra support wire. For unusual shapes, or exceptionally large pieces, please consult the Show Chair or a veteran QC member for advice.

Quilt exhibitors must provide the crosspiece from which their quilt will hang. Typically, this is a wooden board the exact width of your quilt, which fits in your sleeve, and is of sufficient strength to support the quilt without twisting, sagging, or breaking. Lattice strips (1/4" x 1 1/2" or 3/8" x 1 1/2") can be sufficient for small quilts, but a length of 1"x 2" or similar lumber is necessary to support a larger, heavier quilt. Test your board with your quilt on it. If it is too wobbly, or if it sags or twists, get a stronger board! Drill holes at the upper corners and at any open places in the sleeve (on larger quilts) to accept the hanging wire. A 1/8" drill bit will provide a large enough sized hole.

Garment exhibitors should provide a dress form for displaying their work.

All dress forms and hanging boards must be marked with the owner's name if you wish it to be returned to you at the end of the show. Any board not labeled and any insufficient boards will be considered a donation to the guild.

Quilts are to be delivered between 8 and 9 a.m. on Thursday, May 8, 2003. If you are on the Hanging Committee please remember to bring a ladder to the church on Thursday. If you have one we can borrow, please drop it off with your quilts.

Quilt Delivery Instructions:
All quilts (166) have been accepted for the show.

Please deliver your quilt(s) to the Unitarian Church between 8:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. on Thursday, May 8, 2003.

If you cannot deliver your own quilt, get someone else to deliver it for you.

If a person other than the quilt maker is picking up your quilt on Saturday, May 10, 2003, please notify the staff at the time of delivery.

To be accepted for hanging, each quilt must have:

1. A label sewn to the back of the quilt stating at a minimum your name and town. We will be attaching an ID number to your quilt on the lower right back corner. If your label is in another place on the quilt, sew a piece of muslin to the corner if you want to protect your quilt back from our pin.
2. A minimum 4" wide sleeve sewn across the top of the quilt back. Quilts over 50" wide should have a split sleeve for an extra support wire.
3. The crosspiece from which your quilt will hang. This is a wooden board the exact width of your quilt, which fits in your sleeve, and is of strong enough to support your quilt without twisting, sagging, or breaking. Lattice strips (1/4" x 1½" or 3/8" x 1½") can be sufficient for small quilts, but a length of 1"x3" or similar lumber is necessary to support a larger, heavier quilt. Please test your board with your quilt on it. If it is too wobbly, or if it sags or twists, get a stronger board!

Drill holes at the upper corners and at any open places in the sleeve (on larger quilts) to accept the hanging wire. A 1/8" drill bit will provide a large enough sized hole.

4. Garment exhibitors must have a dress form for displaying their work.

All hanging boards and dress forms must be marked with your name if you wish it to be returned to you at the end of the show. Any board not labeled, and any insufficient boards, will be considered a donation to the guild.

Show Volunteer Instructions - 2003

Hang Show Volunteers

- Arrive at the Unitarian Church between 9:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. on Thursday, May 8, 2003, and expect to stay until all the quilts are hung. It usually takes the better part of the day.
- Lunch and refreshments will be provided.
- Thursday Workers receive one days free admission to the show in exchange for their efforts. Be sure to check in and out with volunteer coordinators to be on the volunteer lists.

Gate Instructions

- Check yourself in, and direct other volunteers to check in, in the members' room (kitchen). Get and wear your name-tag.
- Donation of \$5.00. (Children under 12 free, no seniors discount). Each person receives a brochure.
- Money is kept in cash box and handed over only to Treasurer Tammy Feldman, V.P. Heidi Bercovici, or their designated assistant
- Members who have worked on Thursday, are admitted free on either Friday or Saturday. All other members are admitted free only on the day they are working.
- Non-working members must pay an entrance fee.
- All sales go through the boutique. Direct inquiries to Barbara Carney or her staff.
- Our advertisers have been given tickets for free admittance any time during the show. Welcome them warmly!
- Tell our visitors that photographs may be taken for personal use only. Anyone who wishes to take photographs must sign a permission form at the gate.
- Remember to advise visitors of the available gallery tours.

Hostess/Host Instructions

- Check in with Captain and get your white gloves and name tags in the members' room (kitchen). Get and wear your name-tag.
- No eating in the exhibit rooms
- Keep pens (or anything else damaging) away from the quilts
- A chart listing the quilts, and those not registered, will be posted at the door.

Breakdown Instructions

- Arrive at the church by 3:45 p.m. on Saturday, May 10 to check in and get information and instruction from your Captain. Free admission.
- Quilts will be dismantled promptly at 4:00 p.m.
- Purchased quilts must be claimed on Saturday, May 11, 2003, at 4:45 through the boutique or its owner if she/he has claimed the quilt.

Members' Night Volunteers

- Arrive at 6:30 to assist in set up of upstairs and downstairs areas.
- Remember to clean up completely at the end of the event. For your security, ensure that two members lock up and leave together.

For all volunteers:

- Please remember to help us keep the church clean at all times. We are responsible for cleaning up the kitchen and disposing of the trash we generate during the show, so please try to keep things tidy and consider taking some of our trash home with you.
- Check with your captain to see if help is needed in other areas. The member who is staffing the kitchen may need a break from time to time. Please check in and offer to help.

Thanks to **Christiane Schrebler** for "Quilts: Old & New a similar view" by Paul D. Pilgrim and Gerald E. Roy. This is the catalog of an exhibit at the Museum of the American Quilter's Society in Paducah, Kentucky in 1993 that paired antique and contemporary quilts with related designs.

Thanks to **Sue McDonnell** for "Motifs for Crazy Quilting: Techniques for embroidering and embellishing crazy quilts" by J. Marsha Miehler and "Tied up! Fabulous patterns for quilts, decor, clothing & more --- with fabrics & men's ties!" by Gail Ellspermann and Frances Krupka. Both these books are full of line drawings suitable for crazy quilts and redwork embroidery.

New Books

"Color by Design: Paint and print with dye" by Ann Johnston gives almost 50 progressively complex exercises on painting and printing natural fibers with Procion fiber-reactive dyes. It covers every possible variation of wet or dry fabric, thick or thin dyes, brushes, rollers, spray, sponges, stamps, silk screen, resists, and combinations of several techniques.

"Beaded Embellishment: techniques and designs for embroidering on cloth" by Amy C. Clarke and Robin Atkins begins with a short chapter on bead embroidery in other times and places with beautiful color photos from Romania, Mexico, Africa, Siberia, etc. Then it covers supplies and techniques with clear illustrations of stitches and combinations of beads, some of them three-dimensional. Ten projects include clothing and accessories followed by a chapter on design principles to encourage creativity and a whole section of photos of award-winning beadwork.

Quilters' Connection 2003 Boutique Guidelines

Part of the annual show is our Boutique. This feature allows our members to sell items to the public for a small commission payment to QC. The Boutique will accept for consignment any member's hand-crafted items. These are the guidelines for participation in the boutique.

Display: Consignees must provide display equipment required for their sale items. For example, if you are submitting a wall-hanging, it must have a hanging sleeve and rod or other hanging device. If you are selling clothing best displayed on hangers, you must provide attractive clothes hangers. Remember to label props/baskets with a tag, your name and address and the words: NOT FOR SALE. Items needing protection should be attractively packaged. There will be no sale of fabric by bolt or by the piece at the Boutique.

Inventory: You need to fill out two inventory sheets and bring them with you when you come to drop off your items for the boutique. One sheet will be for our records, and the other for your receipt. You must have this sheet(s) with you on Saturday to pick up your items. (Inventory forms will be included in the March *Quiltations* and will be available at the March meeting.)

Labeling Items: Each item you submit for sale should be labeled. Do not use stick-on labels; small tags affixed with safety pins are best. Be sure that all items are priced. Labels should include the following information: 1. Your name (full last name); 2. A description of the item that matches your inventory description; 3. The price of the item (multiples of 25¢ -- Example: \$4.00, \$4.25, \$4.50, \$4.75, etc.); 4. Please put all information on the same side of the ticket -- nothing on the back. For example, a lavender sachet could have the following label - Jane Quilter, LS - \$4.00. Clearly label your display items such as baskets or any props: "FOR DISPLAY ONLY - NOT FOR SALE, RETURN TO (YOUR NAME)".

Pricing: Remember that all items, including show quilts for sale, are subject to a 15% QC Boutique commission.

Check In: Boutique items for sale will be accepted from 8AM to 11AM on Thursday, May 8, 2003. Check in only with someone authorized to sign the inventory form. Bring both copies of your completed inventory form. The boutique keeps one copy of your signed inventory as reference and for bookkeeping purposes. The earlier we get your items, the better we can plan their display. Be sure all items are properly labeled.

We will not accept unlabeled items. We are asking that you also sign the inventory sheets showing that you agree with the numbers of your check-in items on the checklist and that you agree to the final numbers and/or counts as they were brought into the boutique.

Check Out: Please pick up unsold items between 4:30PM and 5:00PM Saturday, May 10, 2003. You must present your copy of your inventory form to check out along with a self-addressed stamped envelope so we can mail you your check. No one will be allowed in the pick-up area until all boutique items have been organized. Please, no early birds and no exceptions. Please check out only with someone authorized to sign your inventory. Remember to sign both copies of your inventory form to indicate that you are accepting items returned to you and that you agree with the final signed form. If there is any discrepancy, the guild uses the sales receipts to determine final payment for items sold.

Lost or Stolen Items: Quilters Connection cannot be responsible for lost or stolen items. We will take reasonable precautions to protect all items submitted to the boutique.
