Our magazine subscriptions include American Quilter, Quilting Arts, and Art/Quilt. New books are purchased each year with a budget from your dues. Please note any books you think many of us would enjoy and call us or give us a note at our meetings. We also get 2 free books twice a year of their choice from That Patchwork Place.

We hope all our members will make use of the library every month because we have many more books and magazines on hand than space to store them at the church in Arlington. You may take as many items home as you like but please return them at the next meeting for someone else to enjoy. If you can't attend the next meeting, send your materials back with another member. Each summer we make a big effort to retrieve long lost library materials. Let's set a record this year for borrowing and returning lots of books and magazines every single month.

### **New Books**

"The Quilts of Gee's Bend" is a beautiful coffee table book with photos and essays about the traveling exhibition that has received so much national attention this year. The quilts were all made by African-American quilters in an isolated rural community in Alabama and are now hanging as contemporary art in galleries from Houston to the Whitney Museum in New York. The exhibit will be seen at the MFA in Boston from June 1 to August 21, 2005. The photos show the quilts, the quilters, and historic images of their community taken during the 1930s.

### Star Quilts in Lowell

This fall the New England Quilt Museum will be presenting two exhibitions of star quilts. Let It Shine: Improvisation in African-American Star Quilts (September 11 November 9, 2003) is an exhibition of twenty-three improvisational quilts made by twenty quiltmakers. Because stars are arguably the most popular patterns for antique American quilts, Sleeping Under the Stars (November 13, 2003 January 10, 2004) will explore the many different styles of nineteenth century star quilts.

It is called "It's in the Bag!" and will feature all kinds of bags for all purposes.
