## What are those tables for?

Have you ever wondered about the tables on the Mezzanine at the beginning of each meeting?

Sales Table - stop by a visit with Robin Fan. She's got one of the best jobs at QC, as she gets to go shopping for the rest of us. Robin buys all sorts of commonly used quilt supplies at wholesale prices and sells them to guild members with no mark-up. Let her know if there are any special items you'd like her to carry.

Adopt-a-Fabric - did you buy too much fabric or change your mind, but can't bring yourself to throw it out? Are you done with that pattern, magazine or book? You need to package them up and see RoseMary Koch at the Adopt-a-Fabric table. Or, maybe you will find that special little something to buy to finish a project. QC benefits by only taking 10% of the sale.

Library - all you need is your membership card to check out one of QC's quilt books, magazines, DVDs, or VHS tapes. Martha Supnik maintains the QC Library. We have an extensive collection that can be loaned to members. Martha is always on the lookout for suggestions or will accept donations.

Miscellaneous - On occasion, there are other tables and/or displays on the Mezzanine. We often have an Information table set up with flyers displayed. They are usually advertising other guilds quilt shows or special sales that would be of interest to quilters. In the past, some of our guest speakers have also set up a table to sell books, material, and patterns.

So, when you come to the next meeting, take a few minutes to check out those tables! You never know what you might find.

## Financial Update

Quilters' Connection finished another successful year and our financial state is strong. We had seven fabulous speakers and workshops, the Winter Free Workshop, a Get-Away Weekend, and topped it with our 31<sup>st</sup> Annual Quilt Show.

The quilt show itself was a success in many ways. Each of the three components of the show - the Raffle Quilt, the Boutique, and the Gate - all generated income. Some of our general expenses were more than anticipated. Some of these expenses were start-up costs that were one-time investments, such as the purchase of the credit card authorization machine. The bottom line is that we did not generate any excess income that could be used to support additional donations or programs.

After much discussion several years ago, the Board voted to spend-down some of our excess savings, in a controlled manner. The objective was to do so in a way that would benefit as many members of the guild as possible. This year our overall working capital was reduced by \$5,200.

The Board has been able to offer workshops for a discounted amount, increase our annual donation to the New England Quilt Museum, and continue to offer our Winter Free Workshop.

Quilting Arts Magazine June/July 2008 issue 33 has articles on fusible film, discharging on cotton or silk, crayon rubbing, painting, digital image manipulation, artist profiles of Maya Schonenberger, Fulvia Luciano, and Patricia Mattison, machine needle felting, adinkra cloth stamping, embellishment with thread trash, image transfers on paper or cloth, screen printing, Xerox lithography, fabric collage, silk fiber bowls, paper, fabric and wood panel quilts, and paper quilts from the "true colors" readers challenge.

Quilting Arts Magazine August/September 2008 issue 34 has articles on the new venue for Art Quilts at the Sedgwick, rusting fabric, deconstructed screen printing, digital image manipulation, artist profiles of Linda MacDonald of California and Dale Rollerson of Perth, Australia, hand-dyed silk charmeuse, quilted pet portraits, a needle-felted landscape (by QC member Ferne Weissman), indigo dyeing, a green quilts exhibit at the Latimer Quilt Center, embellishing with recycled objects, some 2009 Calendar Contest winners, and "Go Green" mini quilt challenge winners.

American Quilter Magazine July 2008 has articles on color in fabric landscapes, a school quilting project, a quilt of vintage hankies, Michigan quilters who ride bikes to quilt shops together, part 2 of a 3-part mystery quilt, printing images on organza, a baby quilt pieced of pinwheels and strips, award-winning quilts and wearables from the contest in Paducah in April 08, a variation on the rail fence pattern, two pages of info on ink jet printers for quilters, pieced quilts that simulate Celtic appliqué designs, and a quilt featuring appliqué with transparent fabrics.

American Quilter Magazine September 2008 features men quilters with articles on David Taylor, Sandi Cummings, and George Siciliano, satin stitch appliqué by Carol Taylor, water soluble freezer paper for appliqué, quilted landscapes of canyon country, collecting quilt-related art objects, part 3 of a mystery quilt, a UFO challenge, blanket stitch machine appliqué by Ricky Tims, a log cabin star quilt by Scott Murkin, quilts for men by Joe Cunningham, design based on the proportions of the "golden mean," Victorian cabinet card photos containing quilts, French-knot embroidery, and a stained glass appliqué quilt in memory of the horse Barbaro.
