## Increase in Membership Dues

Our Treasurer, Betsy Habich, requested the Executive Board increase our yearly dues, by \$10 in all categories. Over several years in the past, QC developed a surplus. The Executive Board at that time decided to give back the surplus to the membership by subsidizing the cost of workshops and making charitable donations to the New England Quilt Museum and the Arsenal Center for the Arts.

Over the last few years, the cost of programs and workshops has increased while other sources of guild income, specifically the sale of tickets for the raffle quilt, have lagged. Together with the spend-down of the "historical" surplus, these changes mean that maintaining the level of quality we rely on QC to provide is becoming harder to do. This problem has been on the Guild's radar for some time, but a decision was needed because the slate of programming and workshops for next year, which comprise QC's largest expense, are being finalized now. We need this increase to continue our very fine line up of programs, the high quality of our speakers, and the informative workshops. We need this increase to continue to host QC's unique and special events like the Winter Free Workshop, Scholarships, Member's Night at our Annual Quilt Show in May, and Get-A-Way Weekend. We, of course, need to meet the needs of our group as quilters.

The Executive Board voted unanimously to put this increase in place for our next Membership Year -- Regular from \$30 to \$40, Associate from \$20 to \$30, International from \$30 to \$40, and Student from \$10 to \$20.

We hope to have ten different instructors; five in the morning and five in the afternoon. Pat Delaney's quilt "My Dorothy Complex: I'm Crazy About Red Shoes" has been juried into The Perfect Fit: Shoes Tell Stories at Fuller Craft Museum in Brockton, Massachusetts--New England's only museum of contemporary craft. The show will run from June 6, 2009 to January 3, 2010 and then travel to other venues. Fuller Craft Museum notes that the show will be curated by Wendy Tarlow; she has strong family ties to Brockton's shoe industry, and will explore how shoe forms can tell stories addressing topics such as gender, history, sexuality, race, class, and culture.

Also, Pat's quilt "Inspiration Draws from Nature's Art" was awarded Best of Show, Best Machine Quilting, and a craftsmanship award at The Gathering in Nashua, New Hampshire last Fall.

Miriam K. Sokoloff will be teaching a workshop, "Fantasy Fabric Hamentaschen" for the Pomegranate Guild of Judaic Needlework on Wednesday afternoon, February 11 in Newton. She will be giving the same workshop at the Guild's National Convention in Enfield, CT in May.

## Not to be Missed Boston Area Shows

There are several current exhibitions in the Boston area that may be of interest to QC members:

First and foremost there are three shows at the Danforth Museum in Framingham that are a "must see" for quilters. Many of us received notice of "Mixed Media Fiber Art" curated by Jeanne Williamson, which is a small, but rich collection of contemporary quilts. In a nearby gallery, "Faith Ringold: Story Quilts" is on display, and if you have never seen one of these quilts in person, this is your chance. However, the blockbuster of a fiber show does not actually contain any fiber art. The very large scale paintings in "Sedrick Huckaby: A Love Supreme" engulf you in the love that this extremely talented painter has for his family and which he has poured into paintings of his family quilts. The four walls of the room are covered with joyous portraits of fabric and overwhelm you with their emotional warmth. All exhibits are up until March 1, 2009.

Those of you who may be interested in seeing two of the artists I featured in my November lecture: Jennifer Perry's architectural drawings made with human hair are featured in "Opening Lines" at the New Art Center in Newton, which runs until February 22, 2009. And Dora Hsiung's colorful fiber work will be at the Depot Square Gallery in Lexington from February 3 - March 1, 2009.
