## Proposed By Law Change

“The By Laws of QUILTERS CONNECTION may be amended by a 2/3 vote of members present and voting at a meeting, provided that the proposed amendment has been read at a previous meeting or provided that members have been otherwise notified.”

What the Executive Board wants to do is change Article II, paragraph B, of the By Laws

FROM:

B. The eight voting members of the executive Board shall consist of the elected Officers: the President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer and the appointed Chairs of the Program, Newsletter, Membership and Quilt Show Committees.

TO:

B. The eight voting members of the executive Board shall consist of the elected Officers: the President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, the appointed Chairs of the Program, Membership and Quilt Show Committees and an appointed Member at Large.

Jessica announced this at the September meeting and the proposed amendment is printed in the October Quiltations and a vote will be taken at the October meeting; if a majority approves, the change is effected.

Reason: The last 2 Newsletter Chairpersons did not feel their position should be on the Executive Board, Eboard, as they reported the news and did not have positions that created change for QC. The EBoard voted to remove this position after discussing it for 2 years. If this vote passes at the next QC meeting, we would be looking for volunteers to fill this position. The amount is dependent on the tuition of the course and is a maximum of \$500. Applicants can enroll in traditional or contemporary quilt related courses in design, color, surface design, innovative fiber, textile construction, textile or quilt history, quilt appraisal, or textile conservation. To further the assimilation of these ideas, recipients of the scholarships are required to share their experiences with the membership. The scholarships are available to all members and may be applied to a variety of educational opportunities.
